Councilmember Kolb stated she does not support this item. She stated there are so many businesses that have these devices that bring in a fair amount of money and this facility does not contribute taxes to the City.

Councilmember Herbst agreed with Councilmember Kolb.

Mayor Ryan confirmed the devices have been in the facility for years. City Clerk Cross replied the City discovered the devices and the City requested the facility to license the devices or remove the devices. She stated the devices belong to a vendor and the facility receives a portion of the proceeds.

Councilmember Clark clarified the facility had the devices for years, but have never applied for a license. City Clerk Cross replied that is correct and that the devices belong to a vendor and the facility receives a commission.

Councilmember Kolb stated all vendors in the City of Blaine have to be licensed. She repeated she does not support this item.

Councilmember Herbst stated he does not support this item. He stated the facility does not pay taxes on the property and the road is going to need work.

Councilmember Clark asked if it is the responsibility of the vendor or the establishment to secure the license.

City Clerk Cross replied the establishment needs to apply for the license.

Councilmember Clark confirmed that the City had not granted the facility a device license before. City Clerk Cross replied that is correct.

Councilmember Bourke asked about the criteria to get a device license. City Clerk Cross stated the establishment applies and the City tells them what they need to do.

Councilmember Clark asked if vending machines are licensed. City Clerk Cross stated vending machines are not licensed.

Planning and Community Development Director Schafer stated in October 2011, the Family Auto Care and Transmission applied and received a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to store two to four vehicles outside of their tenant space. He stated after the approval of the CUP, the applicant approached City staff to determine if they could also have an indoor vehicle show room in their tenant space. He stated the applicant wishes to have one to five vehicles inside the tenant space to sell. He stated Family Auto Care and Transmission will obtain a dealer's license and the City will sign off on the license with the provisions of the Conditional Use Permit attached to the license.

Councilmember Clark asked what kind of cars Family Auto Care and Transmission will be selling. Planning and Community Development Director Schafer replied it is not stated.

Binh Ho, 1550 91st Avenue NE, Suite 103, stated he is the owner of Family Auto Care and Transmission and the cars on display will be used rental return cars that are worth \$10,000 or less and under warranty.

Councilmember Clark asked about the Family Auto Care and Transmission's customer base. Mr. Ho replied customers that use his repair service want to purchase used vehicles from them as well.

Planning and Community Development Director Schafer stated the Council has two items to consider for the Hans Hagen Homes development. He stated The Lakes of Radisson 49th Addition proposal consists of subdividing approximately 6.52 acres into a subdivision of 9 single family homes. The preliminary plat includes two outlots for drainage and utility purposes.

Councilmember Bourke asked about the parcel that is sandwiched between the park and the development. Planning and Community Development Director Schafer replied that is Outlot A.

Councilmember Kolb asked if there will be any alteration of the wetland area. Planning and Community Development Director Schafer replied there is a small alteration of the wetland that is 1/10 of an acre in order to provide a backyard for one lot and road access. He stated watershed requirements have been met.

Councilmember Kolb asked if this parcel was a planned development. Planning and Community Development Director Schafer replied this development was planned in 2003. He stated the land was graded in 2005 in anticipation of development.

Councilmember Kolb stated she agrees with the residents about not building in this area.

Councilmember Clark asked if there was money in the Open Space Fund for the City to buy the land. City Manager Arneson stated the balance in the Open Space Fund is \$605,000.

Councilmember Kolb asked if this parcel was considered as open space. Planning and Community Development Director Schafer replied this land was not intended to be open space.

Councilmember Swanson stated he is concerned about the Council buying land for open space.

Councilmember Clark stated the City is not in a position to buy land to keep as open space. He stated these are different builders that purchased the land and they have the right to build on it.

Councilmember Bourke asked about Outlot A, he would like to see this lot dedicated to the City under park dedication. Planning and Community Development Director Schafer replied Outlot A would be the City's storm pond and wet land.

Councilmember Swanson asked what type of housing was originally approved for this development. Planning and Community Development Director Schafer replied originally detached townhomes. He stated these homes will be single family homes.

Councilmember Herbst stated developments are designed years before residents move in.

Councilmember Kolb stated she was seeking clarification for the residents.

Planning and Community Development Director Schafer stated this second item is for a Conditional Use Permit which sets the zoning standards. He stated Hans Hagen will have four to five models and the home sizes will be tailored to fit the lots.

Councilmember Swanson asked about the available lot supply in the City. Planning and Community Development Director Schafer replied the City's lot supply is down to 430 developments. He stated it is expected that land development will increase in 2012 with smaller plat requests of 9-15 lots.

Mayor Ryan opened the public hearing at 8:15 pm.

City Clerk Cross stated there are two proposed Charter amendments for Council's consideration. She stated the first proposal is a housekeeping amendment that

would change the word "district" to "ward" throughout the Charter to make the election language portion consistent with the Secretary of State's records, Legislature, Anoka County and other Anoka County cities, and other metro cities. She stated the proposal would make Sec. 2.03 and 2.03(a) of the Blaine City Charter consistent with the language used on all election forms used at the county and state level. She stated all election forms used throughout the state refer to wards and precincts. She stated it will also make the Charter language consistent with the election management system that is being implemented throughout Anoka County in 2012.

City Clerk Cross stated the second proposal would require all write-in candidates for City Council to file a written request to compile their write-in votes. She stated a candidate who wants write-in votes to be counted in the general election would have to file a written request with the City Clerk's office no later than seven days before the general election. She stated all other write-in votes cast for City Council candidates who have not filed a written request would be treated collectively as votes for a single candidate. She stated any City Council candidate who sincerely wants their votes counted only has to register (no fee required) with the City Clerk's office seven days before the General Election and their votes will be tallied by the election judges.

Mayor Ryan asked when this item will come back for the Council's vote. City Clerk Cross replied this item will come back to the Council on March 15.

Mayor Ryan closed public hearing at 8:20 p.m.

Councilmember Clark stated Anoka County is broken into districts, he asked if they will become wards. City Clerk Cross replied there is a difference between districts, precincts and wards. She stated sections of cities are referred to wards. She stated the counties have different jurisdictions.

Councilmember Clark stated he is undecided on the change from district to ward.

Councilmember Herbst asked Councilmember Clark why he is undecided.

Councilmember Clark replied his concern is with the meaning of the word "ward." He stated wards are used in urban settings like Minneapolis.

Councilmember Swanson asked if the Council vote passes four to three, does it go to a ballot. City Attorney Sweeney replied that is correct.

City Clerk Cross stated even small cities use the word "ward."

Declared by Mayor Ryan that Ordinance No. 12-2239, "An Ordinance Amending Chapter 2, Form of Government, Sec. 2.03 Elective Offices, and Sec. 2.03(A), Districts, and Chapter 4, Nominations and Election, Sec. 4.06, Candidate for Office" be introduced and placed on file for second reading.
