

As an Olympian, National Coach, and recreational curler, I am proud to have been part of the discovery and planning for a permanent curling facility at the Fogerty Arena site in Blaine, MN.

Over the past four years it has been my pleasure to consult with Mark Clasen of Fogerty on a number of questions surrounding the viability of such a facility in the Twin Cities.

What I have said in the past and will continue to say is that now is the best time and the Twin Cities is the best place for a permanent, year-round, curling facility to serve many purposes.

Besides the standard leagues and club membership that most clubs support, a facility with the unique ability to be open 365 days a year should be able to host multiple leagues throughout the year. The added time will also allow for the following types of programs at a minimum:

- Youth Learn to Curl Camps
- Youth High Performance Camps
- Youth leagues and daily instruction
- Adult Learn to Curl Camps
- Adult High Performance Camps
- Corporate Events

In addition, Fogerty has the added benefit of the two existing Hockey sheets that can quickly be turned in to additional curling ice for large events. One such event was held in Fort Wayne, Indiana this last summer and drew nearly 100 teams (400 players) from all over North America.

As a National Team Coach for USA Curling I cannot promise anything but I am certain that this new facility would be a primary destination for our Olympic hopefuls to train. It just makes sense. The facility is near a major international airport, it is centrally located and in a well-known media market. Not to mention that there is only one, 3 sheet facility in the country that keeps ice 365 days a year, which has become a necessity for our top athletes.

One of Fogerty's primary concerns has been the idea that they "don't know curling" and they want to be sure that the club and the programs start off on the right foot. My assurances to them have been simple....Curlers are very passionate about what they do. There will be many, many people waiting in line to help make sure this facility is a success. The reason I know that is due to the overwhelming growth of the sport in the last decade. Membership across the country is up 52% since the Olympics in 2002! Many clubs have started and are now playing on Hockey ice and are very successful. You only have to look at the St. Paul Curling Club to know that the sport is growing. A decade ago the St. Paul club had a comfortable base of 800 members. For the past 3 years, the club has topped out at 1400 members, and is actively turning people away.

In a related note, I would be remiss if I did not mention that curling has its roots in community and family. I, myself, was taught the game by my father and in any curling club you will find many families that curl. It is the family roots and the passion of the players that make curling the great sport it is! I can honestly say that Blaine and its residents could only benefit from having curlers among them.

In short, I cannot think of a better situation for curling, Fogerty and the City of Blaine. I would expect this facility to be the home of many curling champions and many great community members and families in the future.
