

Bee Ordinance Information

City Council Workshop October 12, 2020

Background

▶ In July 2020 community members attended the open forum at a city council meeting and asked that the council consider allowing bee keeping within the City.



 Council directed staff to bring information to a workshop on August 9^{th.}


► At the workshop, staff was directed to draft an ordinance with fairly strict requirements for the keeping of bees.



Current Ordinance Requirements

Bees are allowed in the FR (Farm Residential) zoning district only.

One bee hive per acre is allowed in this zoning district.





Proposed Ordinance Requirements

All bee keeping operations shall be registered with the City for a fee.



- Registration = application and submittal of site plan with location and specifics of the hives.
- ► Hives could be kept anywhere in the City on lots in excess of ½ acre.
- ► All FR(Farm Residential) references would be removed from the ordinance.
- ▶ No more than two colonies per lot over ½ acre.

Proposed Ordinance Requirements Continued



- ► Rear yard only, setback of 30 feet from all property lines. 25 feet from any trail easement.
- Colonies must be 50 feet from homes on adjacent property.
- ► A consistent water source must be provided and shown on site plan.
- ► Applicant to provide evidence of completion of beekeeping course from the U of M or other comparable institution.


Proposed Ordinance Requirements Continued

- Upon receiving a beekeeping application, the City will notify all property owners within 200 feet of the property.
- ► Adjacent property owners will be given two weeks to respond to the notice with any objection.
- Adjacent property owners will be specifically asked about bee allergies in the household.
- ▶ If bee allergies are present in an adjacent household within 200 feet, the permit will be denied.



Additional information/Conclusion

- License must be renewed each year with an annual fee charged. The notification process will be conducted each year.
- Proposed ordinance modeled after Fridley's ordinance.
- > Staff suggests an annual fee of \$75 with a renewal fee of \$25.
- ► Is Council supportive of a new ordinance to allow more bees in the city?
- If so, a code amendment will be initiated.
